The Board of Mission and Outreach was created to extend God's love past our own church walls. On this page you will find descriptions of some of the missions the United Church supports through the donation of resources and members' time and talents.

WALLACE HOUSE

Wallace House is located just north of The Church of The Good Shepherd at 126 North Main Street. It is available on a first come first served basis for emergency shelter and transitional housing for families working from homelessness to independence.

There is currently one emergency unit (that sleeps up to two adults and two or three children) and one transitional unit (that sleeps up to two adults and two children). Only one family can be housed in each unit at any one time. A family may consist of one person.

A staff person is generally at the Wallace House Monday through Thursday and Saturday, 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM. During these hours the "emergency Room" is open for those in need of a shower also.

Outside of these hours, you may refer homeless persons to the Wallace House phone number. The call is forwarded on to someone who will assist them. The phone number is 894-2727.

The emergency unit does not have cooking facilities. If the individual or family needs food, we can refer them to St. Peter's Rectory where a bag of food may be obtained. Wallace House does provide some vouchers to local restaurants and supermarkets, but these are very limited at this point.

Communities and families are assisted in evaluating and assessing their current situation, planning their future and developing strategies by which they can bring about the required transformation from the present to the future.

COUNCIL ON AGING

The Council on Aging provides comprehensive services to seniors in Sonoma County, including dining rooms, meals on wheels, legal assistance, financial management, transportation, respite care, care management and transportation. CLOVERDALE FOOD PANTRY

Our church, along with First Baptist and St. Peter's Catholic Churches, along with the Kiwanis Club, have teamed up to provide a local food pantry. The Food Pantry is located at the corner of 2nd. Street and Commercial Street, and is available from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm on Fridays. Some of the food comes from the Food Bank of Sonoma County, and some comes from the generosity of merchants such as Ray's Food Market in Cloverdale and Andy's Produce in Sebastopol. We typically serve 75 to 80 families each week, with an average family size of around 5.
